

Clover Corner

The Windowsill Garden Project will take place during the months of March and April in all the K-4 through sixth grades in Harlan County and Harlan Independent Schools, Sunshine School, Harlan County Christian, Grays Knob, and Verda Headstart. This project involves planting tomato seeds in a peat pellet cup and caring for them five weeks before taking them home to be planted outside this spring when chance of frost has passed. This is one of our largest projects of the year. We will also be giving flyers teaching how to plant the tomatoes in the ground when the chance of frost has passed.
